Oneonta, NY – The New York Council of Nonprofits (NYCON) is pleased to announce the launch of the 2025 Otsego County Mini-Grant Program in partnership with The Scriven Foundation. The focus of this effort is to measurably improve the governance and management of qualifying Otsego County 501(c)(3) charitable nonprofits.

Applications will be accepted immediately and through Friday, March 14, 2025. Initiated in 2004, this program is made possible with underwriting from The Scriven Foundation. The Mini-Grant Program is an important resource for local nonprofits facing significant challenges or striving to improve the effectiveness and efficiency of organizational management, governance, and/or program services.

There is a total of \$50,000 of grant funds available and grant awards will range from \$500 to \$2,500 per nonprofit applicant. Grants will be awarded competitively to qualifying nonprofits with approved project activities.
